RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT THE FEBRUARY 7 ELECTION COMMISSION REPORT, KEEPING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE RIDING OF D'ARCY-MCGEE INTACT AND DEPLORING ITS SUDDEN TURNAROUND OF MARCH 2, 2017

WHEREAS, on February 7, 2017, the Commission tabled a report in which it proposed a revised version of the boundaries of the electoral divisions of Québec and proposed a final electoral map that maintained the electoral riding of D'Arcy-McGee in its current configuration;

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2017, the Commission published in the Gazette officielle du Québec the final version of the electoral map which, without any warning or explanation, amended its decision of February 7, 2017 and substantially altered the boundaries of the electoral riding of D'Arcy-McGee:

WHEREAS by this amendment, the electoral riding of D'Arcy-McGee will have around 56,000 voters, making it one of the most populous constituencies in Quebec and will, therefore, seriously dilute the political weight of the residents of the Town of Hampstead;

WHEREAS these changes will result in the loss of an electoral riding on the Island of Montréal and will, therefore, seriously dilute the political weight of the residents of the Island of Montreal;

WHEREAS this change of position seriously undermines public confidence in the objectivity and independence of the Commission;

On motion of Councillor Leon Elfassy, seconded by Councillor Harvey Shaffer, it is UNANAMOUSLY RESOLVED:

That the Town of Hampstead expresses its deep disappointment regarding the Quebec Electoral Representation Commission's decision to not uphold its proposal of the February 7 report to keep the riding of D'Arcy-McGee in its current configuration;

- That the Town of Hampstead informs the *Assemblée nationale du Québec* that the loss of representation caused by the disappearance of a riding on the Island of Montreal seriously dilutes the political influence of its residents;
- That the Town of Hampstead supports the City of Montreal's proposal not to allow any reduction in the number of electoral ridings on the Island of Montréal and calls on the *Assemblée nationale du Québec* to reject the proposed merger of the ridings of Mount Royal and Outremont and significantly alter the boundaries of the riding of D'Arcy-McGee;
- That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Premier of Quebec, the leaders of the various opposition parties, the member of the *Assemblée nationale du Québec* for the riding of D'Arcy-McGee and the mayors of all cities, towns or surroundings of the concerned ridings.
